BSET Endovascular Fellowship Report Rob Davies 2011-2012



I was fortunate to be awarded a Cook/BSET fellowship in 2011 and opted to undertake my fellowship at the Leicester Royal Infirmary in the subspecialist field of peripheral intervention. My weekly timetable included six angiosuite sessions supervised by the vascular interventional radiology (IR) consultant body. I participated in a 1:7 24 hours on call as part of the IR team. There were also ample opportunities to be involved in the EVAR/FEVAR programme, both at a planning and deployment level, and academia.

Overall the fellowship was excellent and offered the full breadth of endovascular experience I had sought; I performed >140 lower limb interventions, 20 EVARs and a variety of 'off-piste' procedures during the six month period. Importantly, this adequately fulfilled the training requirements

for lower limb vascular interventional radiology.

Following the completion of my surgical training I was appointed to the position of consultant vascular and endovascular surgeon at the Leicester Royal Infirmary and have been in post since January 2013. I would impress on future fellows with an interest in lower limb arterial disease to consider Leicester for their fellowship.
